Edmund Sabanegh, Jr., MD, MBA, serves as the system's new President and Chief Executive Officer, joining Guthrie after more than a decade of leadership at the Cleveland Clinic.

Dr. Sabanegh brings extensive experience in multiple aspects of large-practice health care and academic systems to his role at Guthrie. As president of the Cleveland Clinic's main campus and regional hospitals, he led a team of more than 12,000 clinical caregivers, expanded clinical services for the system's patients, and achieved the highest caregiver engagement in the organization's history.

"I'm excited about my new role at Guthrie and leading this dedicated team of caregivers," Dr. Sabanegh says. "My focus will build on the organization's focus on quality, safety, and the patient experience to ensure Guthrie patients receive the care they need and the service they deserve."

Dr. Sabanegh's experience also includes 21 years of service in the U.S. Air Force. He held several executive roles, including Chief of Medical Staff, Chief Consultant for the Surgeon General, and Chief Operating Officer at the largest Air Force hospital in the world.

He has authored more than 200 academic publications and earned a Bachelor of Science in engineering from Princeton University, a medical degree from the University of Virginia, and an MBA from the Weatherhead School of Management at Case Western Reserve University. Dr. Sabanegh completed his urologic surgery residency at Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center and his microsurgery fellowship at the Cleveland Clinic. He is board-certified by the American Board of Urology.

In 2017, Guthrie's Forward Together campaign began with the goal of transforming health care to meet the ever-changing needs of our communities. Support from within those communities allowed us to not only reach, but significantly surpass, our goal of raising \$10 million toward these efforts.

The campaign made the completion of several capital projects possible: the Taylor Family Emergency Department and Heart and Vascular Center at Guthrie Robert Packer Hospital; the East Corning Medical Office Building; Big Flats Specialties and Rehabilitation Services; Newman W. Benson Acute Rehabilitation Unit; and the Renzi Cancer Center at Guthrie Cortland Medical Center.

In addition, campaign support allowed Guthrie to add four new residency and fellowship programs – investments in facilities and talent that will ensure necessary care is available to the communities we serve.

A Collective Effort to Conquer COVID-19

As much of the world seemed to stop when COVID-19 struck, health care workers – including those at Guthrie – soldiered on, facing a crisis unprecedented in our lifetime. With its responsiveness and flexibility put to the test, Guthrie demonstrated new levels of collaboration and innovation, taking on new and unexpected tasks, and continuously evolving to best serve patients and the community.

Weeks before seeing any COVID-19 patients in their own system, Guthrie leadership established emergency operations centers at each hospital. The health system “maintained a patient-centered and coordinated system approach to ensure a consistent response to a rapidly changing emergency spanning Guthrie’s wide geography,” says Michael Scalzone, MD, Executive Vice President and Chief Quality Officer for Guthrie.

In the earliest days, the need for more personal protective equipment (PPE) was paramount to protect staff and patients, and shortages were the biggest constraint, Dr. Scalzone says. Later, a lack of testing and space limitations during infection surges became critical challenges the health system united to overcome. Guthrie has also been heavily involved in vaccine distribution within its 12-county area.

Along the way, Guthrie’s effective response to COVID-19 has been defined by the collaborative efforts of all staff, along with unwavering support from Guthrie’s communities.

“More than 300 local businesses, manufacturers, and individuals provided PPE, hand sanitizer, food, and snacks for our staff, as well as self-care items, artwork, and cards,” says Tricia Huston, Director of Resource Development at Guthrie. “Community donors also contributed nearly \$50,000 to support Guthrie’s Emergency Response Fund.”

The community played a huge role in providing PPE, often using innovative approaches, says Joseph Sawyer, SVP at Guthrie and President of Guthrie Robert Packer Hospital.

“Some manufacturers changed their equipment to produce PPE. Others 3D-printed face shields,” Sawyer says. “And some distilleries and microbreweries in the area began producing and donating isopropyl alcohol as a disinfectant.”

Beyond supplies, the communities Guthrie serves also made extra efforts to offer emotional support in trying times.

“Students from the local schools created cards for patients and staff, and people got together to put on ‘appreciation parades’ outside the hospital,” Sawyer says. “Caravans of cars arrived full of people showing their support for their local hospital and their local heroes – those taking care of patients who had contracted this terrible virus.”

Supporting Frontline Workers With Supplies and Special Gestures

When COVID-19 brought most of the world to a halt in early 2020, health care systems became busier and more vulnerable than ever before. Like most health systems, Guthrie scrambled to gather personal protective equipment and supplies for health care staff and patients via supply chains facing overwhelming demands.

Generous members of the community like Jeff Gural, owner of Tioga Downs Casino Resort, offered whatever support they could – even as they faced their own pandemic problems.

“It became obvious we’d be shut down, and we heard about Guthrie’s needs. We decided we would give them whatever cleaning, sanitizing, and protective supplies we had to help frontline workers stay as safe as possible,” Jeff says.

Within hours of Guthrie’s initial contact with Jeff, staff received a large delivery of hand sanitizer, masks, stanchions, and other supplies that helped the hospitals with their infection control and distancing efforts. Several weeks later, Jeff and the Tioga Downs team gave Guthrie 25 hams so they could serve Easter meals to hardworking staff spending their holiday at the hospitals.

In March 2021, when Tioga Downs reopened, Guthrie employees were offered complimentary rooms at the resort, along with vouchers for the resort’s dining venues. “These people are heroes, and we assumed they were all overworked and exhausted,” Jeff says. “We thought a free night at a hotel and a meal might give them a well-deserved break.”

In addition to their generous gifts to Guthrie, Jeff and his Tioga Downs team have supported local communities in various ways over the last year and a half.

“It was important to show the community that we care, especially in a year everyone was struggling,” he says.

Philanthropy With Personal and Professional Motivations

Ralph Zehr, MD, a retired radiologist, says the name Guthrie is in many ways synonymous with his medical career. Dr. Zehr joined Robert Packer Hospital and Guthrie Clinic in 1968 as a radiology resident. Upon completion of his residency, he joined the Guthrie senior medical staff, retiring at the end of 2009.

Since 1980, he and his wife, Betty, have supported Guthrie’s overall mission, along with the Sayre House of Hope, a temporary residence for Guthrie patients and families. Dr. Zehr says the couple’s “association with Guthrie has contributed greatly to our lives and it is a privilege and a joy to continue our support.”

“Very early in my residency, the advantages at Guthrie became obvious,” Dr. Zehr says. “All the doctors worked under one roof, affording ample opportunities for hallway consultations and reporting radiographic diagnoses to our referring physicians during lunchtime. When invited by the president of the Guthrie Clinic to join the senior medical staff, I did so without hesitation. The level of professional camaraderie that I experienced throughout my entire career far surpassed my expectations.”

Dr. Zehr served as Director of Guthrie’s Radiology Residency Program, President of the Guthrie Robert Packer Hospital medical staff, Editor-in-Chief of *The Guthrie Journal*, and Chairman of the Department of Radiology.

“My educational activities were among the most rewarding, second only to the satisfaction of providing imaging services to my patients, and I continue to serve as a Trustee of the Donald Guthrie Foundation for Medical Education and Research,” Dr. Zehr says.

As Chairman of the Department of Radiology, he saw that the “awesome responsibility of maintaining state-of-the-art medical imaging equipment, with its increasing complexity and expense, was an essential reality if we were to continue the excellent level of medical care that our patients had come to expect.” He developed a deep appreciation for the outstanding generosity expressed by so many in the community and wanted to take part.

Supporting the Sayre House of Hope has long been a part of Dr. and Mrs. Zehr’s philanthropic mission.

How One Young Boy Supports Guthrie

Do you remember the first time you were motivated to flex your philanthropic muscle?

Years from now, 7-year-old John Shattuck will remember the Christmas when he was inspired to give away the allowance he had saved and the miracle that happened shortly thereafter.

"Last December was a tough time for our family, when my 73-year-old father was diagnosed with COVID and entered Guthrie Robert Packer Hospital," explains Kate Shattuck, John's mother. Shattuck's six children, who are close to the grandfather they call "Jajie," were especially upset. "We all had questions, but John, who is the youngest, cut right to the chase. 'Is Jajie going to die?' he asked."

Kate and her husband did their best to explain what they knew, but in honesty, they had to confirm that was a possibility.

"It was a scary time because no one knew what could happen. What really made a difference was that the nurses helped my dad use an iPad so we could see and talk to him during his hospital stay," Kate says. "It encouraged us because we could all see his progress, and I think that communication also helped Dad."

During that time, the Shattucks had their annual meeting with their children to discuss Christmas giving. It has been their practice to give a weekly allowance to their school-age children. The caveat is that the allowance must be divided into portions to save, spend, share, and fund college.

"The December meeting is a time when we discuss where each of us wants to help the community. Each child gets to decide where they are going to give their 'share' money," Kate says. "It's a sweet part of our family tradition at a time of year that is all about the spirit of giving."

John heard his brother and sisters talk about their gifts to a food pantry, a Boy Scout troop, the St. Agnes school (where John is a first grader), and two educational organizations. Over the year, he had dutifully portioned a little over a dollar each week to his "share" container and added some birthday and gift money for a total of \$73.

"When it was his turn to share, John told us he was giving his money to 'Jajie's hospital,'" Kate says. "It was an extraordinary moment that made me realize that as a young boy, John is already thinking deeply about others, about sharing, and how to show thankfulness."

Shortly after that, and just in time for Christmas, Jajie came home in good health. "It was our own Christmas miracle, and when my dad learned about John's donation, it made him feel very proud and very loved," she says.

As the new year began, saving started all over again for the Shattuck children. John eagerly awaits each Saturday morning when he receives his \$7 for the week. He has his eye on some more Legos, for which he will use his "spending" money. But for his "sharing" money, he is not thinking yet about where that will go. He is just proud that, week by week, he adds some more of his allowance to that container and watches it grow.

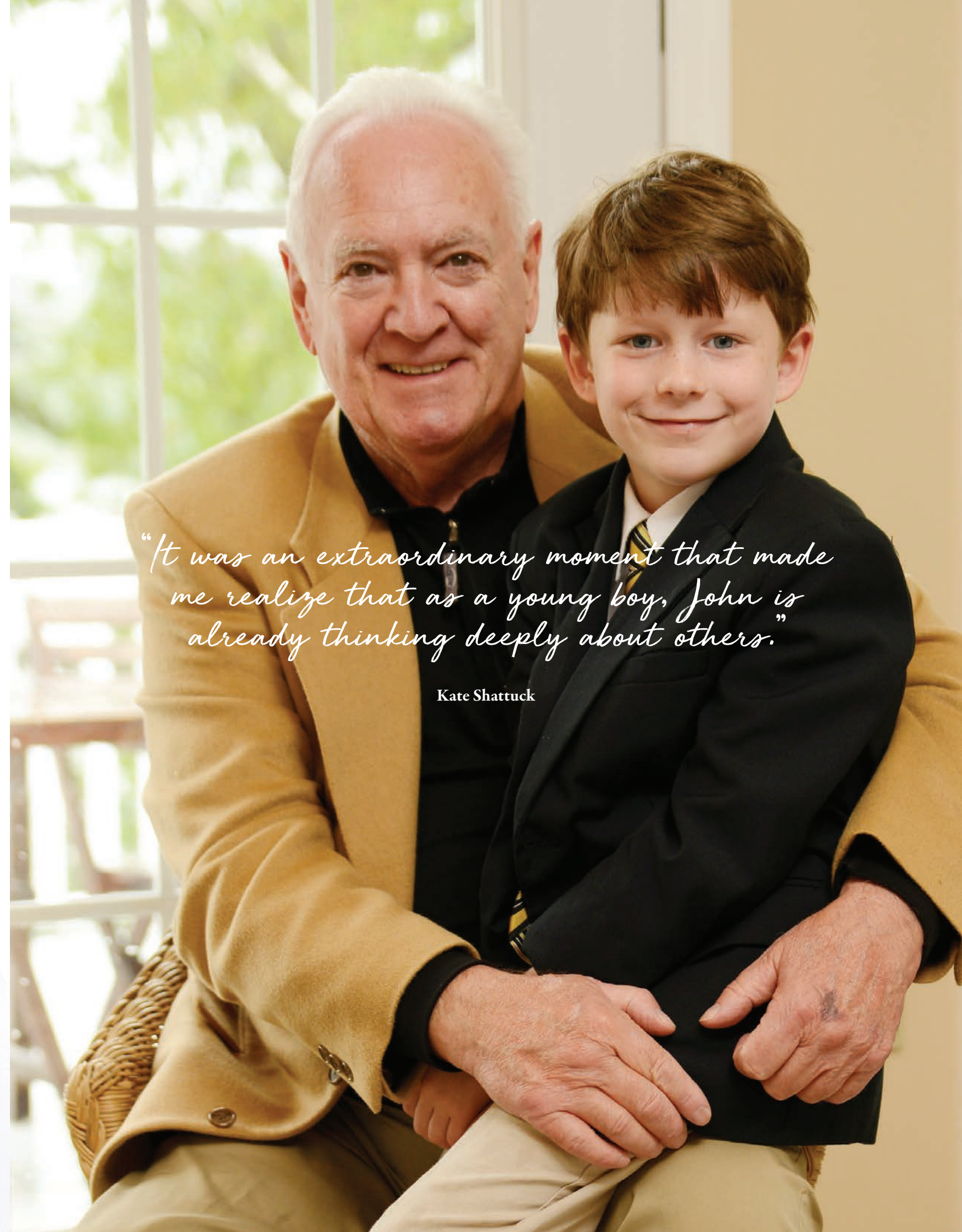

Giving for a Better Community

Nick Renzi knows a lot about the importance of not cutting corners.

He spent 17 years in the highly regulated aerospace industry and the last 25 years at Pall Corporation managing the engineering and manufacturing of sophisticated fluid purification products. As a Senior Vice President of Pall Corporation before his retirement, Nick was responsible for the engineering and manufacturing facilities in Cortland, New York, and in Fajardo, Puerto Rico. Now retired, Nick’s enthusiasm for doing things right has carried forward to his financial support of local charities so that their missions can be accomplished effectively without needing to compromise.

“My wife, Agnes, and sons, Nick Jr. and Chris, and I moved to Cortland in 1971 and fell in love with the area, the people, and the heart of the community,” Nick says. “We have established deep roots over the years, and it has been an honor and a passion for my wife and me to support our community through charitable giving.”

That passion inspired a \$1 million challenge-match donation to the fundraising campaign for a \$10.6 million cancer center at Guthrie Cortland Medical Center. Within two months, more than \$1 million was donated by members of the community. Nick’s matching gift was the most ever donated by one person to Cortland Memorial Foundation.

“Living in this community for 50 years and knowing the people, I never doubted that we would be able to meet the challenge,” Nick says.

Nick and Agnes (who passed away in 2020) have been longtime supporters of the hospital and the nursing and rehabilitation facility, and they are members of the Charles Gibson Legacy Society.

To honor the Renzis, the 10,825-square-foot center, which opened to patients on September 27, was named the Renzi Cancer Center at Guthrie Cortland Medical Center. It features a new state-of-the-art linear accelerator – which delivers high-energy, targeted radiation to tumors – and 10 chemotherapy infusion chairs, additional treatment areas, an on-site pharmacy for preparing medications, phlebotomy draw stations, and private rooms for multidisciplinary services provided by a dietitian and social worker.

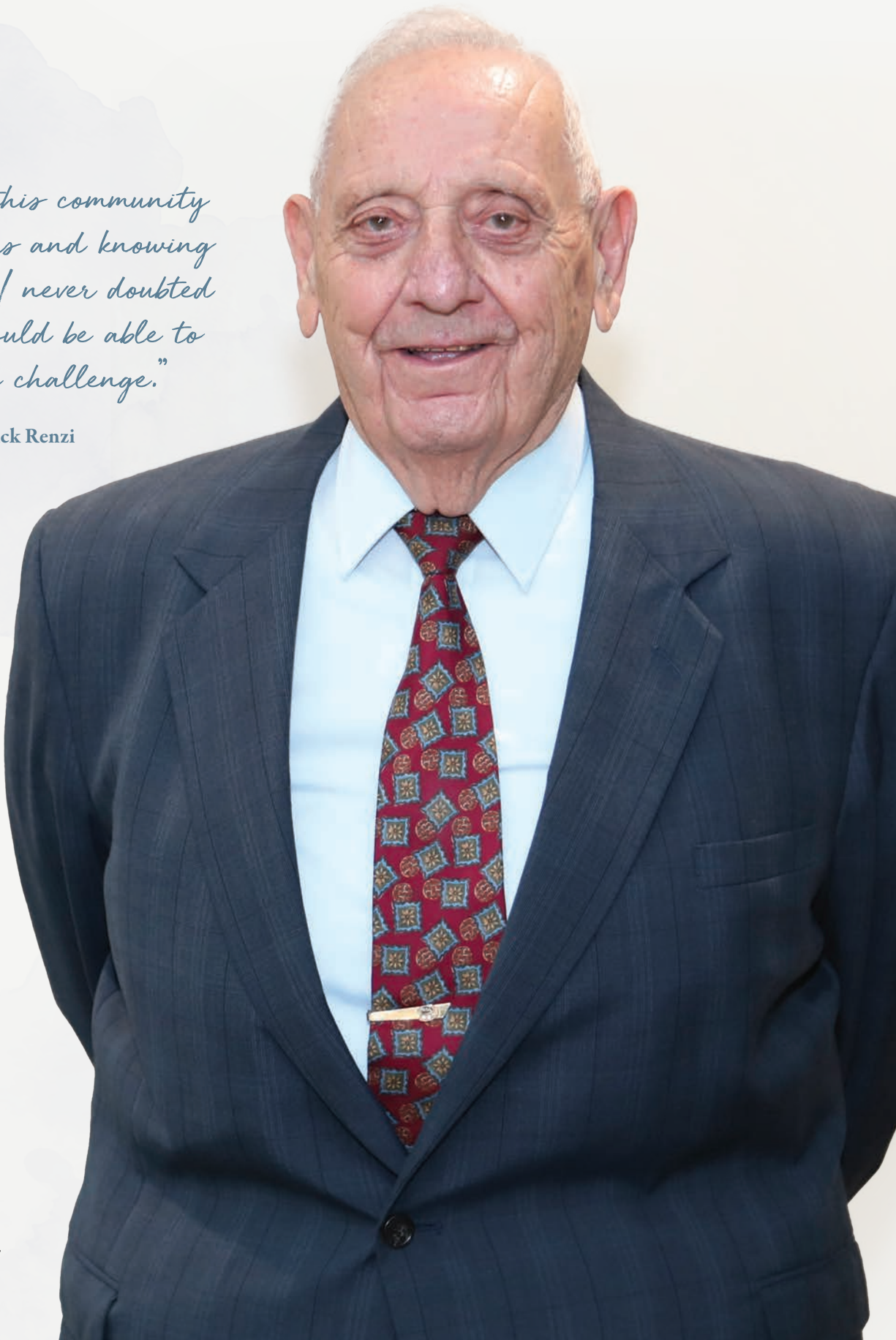
